# C.A. Henning Elementary School

## Troy, Illinois

BUILDING EXTERIOR

Growth in student enrollment caused the need for a major expansion to this pre-K through fifth-grade elementary school. The renovations to C.A. Henning Elementary added 30 classroom spaces for a total of 49 classrooms. The addition allows the district, which had been using trailers to accommodate the growing student body, to meet the educational needs of 1,000 students. The school currently

has an enrollment of 600.

The two-story expansion grew the school building footprint from 39,600 square feet to 98,500 square feet and seamlessly ties new construction into the existing building with brown brick and buff accent striping. The addition adds a second, larger gym and cafeteria that are used by different age groups. A new library has also been added, along with a computer lab and broadcast room. The

existing library was remodeled into a special education area. The building was zoned for lower grade levels at one end and upper grade levels at the opposite end.

A two-story commons area contains a profusion of windows and a grand staircase. It also features colorful patterned walls and corridor floors. Each classroom has a large tackable wall surface for teaching techniques the district has developed. ■
